## **Gothic Cathedral Notes**

- Towers (Bell towers)
  - o Always one bell tower but most often were twin bell tower
  - Functioned as a signal for the townspeople.
- Stained Glass windows
  - o Rose window were common
  - Lots of different colors/ patterns
  - Sometimes displayed stories from the bible because people
- Pointed Arches
  - Not as stable as rounded arches
  - o Elegant
- Statues/ religious figures
  - o All around inside and outside the cathedral
  - o Religious figures from the bible and the Christian religion.
- Spires
  - Tall tower that bring you closer to God
  - Used to locate Cathedral
- Columns/pillars
  - Not traditional Greek Columns
  - Surrounded the Cathedral in and out
- Flying buttresses
  - Take the weight from the buildings to the ground and support buildings
  - Flying Buttresses enables building tall and "light"
- Gargoyles
  - Used for decoration and served as rain gutters
- Vaulted ceilings/vaulted arches
  - o One large arch made up of little arches connected by ribs
  - Not forgiving and challenging to build
  - Root shaped like a cross
- Alter and Chapels
  - Alter/located under spires with lots of gold and a cross of Jesus; only religious figures would go onto alter
  - Chapels around the inside walls
    - People could pray to other saints.
